Additionally, he served homeless veterans in Orange County during law school. In 2016, Advaith graduated Phi Beta Kappa with a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of California, Irvine, and earned his Juris Doctor from Chapman University, Dale E. Fowler School of Law, in 2019.

In his free time, Advaith volunteers with Team Rubicon and is the Service Officer at American Legion Post 177 for the Department of Virginia.
